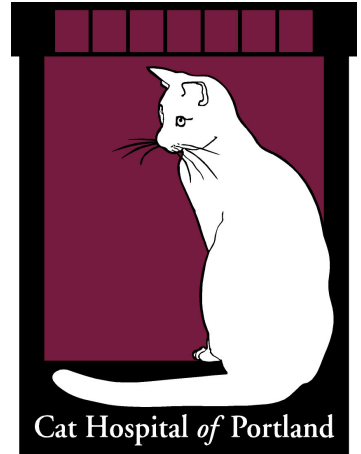
TRADITIONAL CHINESE MEDICINE AND ACUPUNCTURE

Traditional Chinese Medicine can be used to treat almost any imbalance except those requiring surgery. Western medicine can effectively treat acute, traumatic illness, but is limited in its approach to the chronic problems.

Traditional Chinese Medicine is a more rounded and holistic approach. It recognizes patterns of disease and imbalances that Western medicine does not. Traditional Chinese Medicine encompasses a broad framework of interactions. It can pick up an imbalance before it becomes a disease. In this way, it can be used as a preventative therapy to help keep an individual healthy.

As our feline companions' life spans increase, geriatric health care becomes a focus of veterinary practice. With geriatric patients, the primary goal is to promote their quality of life rather than cure their diseases. A number of reports have demonstrated that Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine could help accomplish this goal.

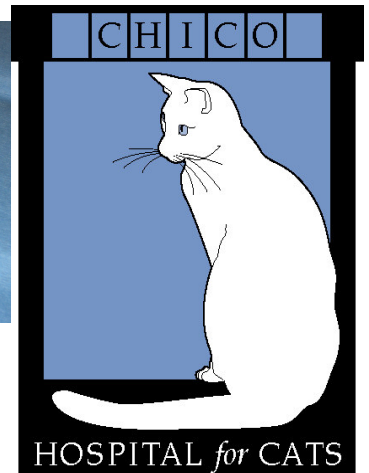
DANGEROUS FOREIGN OBJECTS

EMERGENCY CARE

Are you able to distinguish the signs of minor feline illness from those calling for an immediate trip to the emergency veterinary clinic? Knowing signs of serious symptoms may save you a midnight trip to the emergency clinic. If your cat (or other pets) have any of the signs listed below, take them immediately for care as these are considered emergencies!

- Labored breathing, respiratory distress
- Loss of consciousness
- Difficulty walking or staying on feet
- Inability to urinate
- Penetrating wounds or fractures
- Any evidence of poisoning
- Massive bleeding
- Severe burns
- Frequent vomiting

BE PREPARED

Know the address and phone number of the emergency clinic. Keep this information near your phone at all times.

Transport cat in carrier for everyone's safety.

Take relevant documents, medical records and list of medications your cat may be taking.

Be patient, unstable animals are seen first and there may be a wait.

Be prepared to pay for all emergency services at the time services performed.

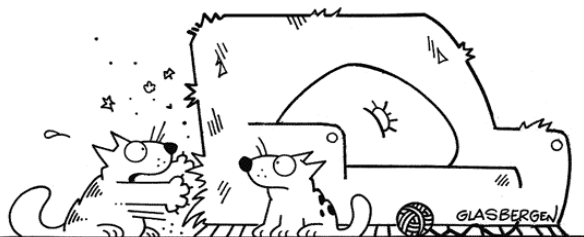
